

HOW TO ACT DURING AN ALERT

- The Homefront Command's Guidelines -



In the Arava, if a siren was to sound, you will have 3 minutes to reach a shelter and then must wait there for 10 minutes. This can prevent injuries resulting from rocket or missile hits, and may even save your life.

During an alert, enter a Secure Space (shelter)

WHAT IS A SECURE SPACE?

- 1. A shelter (Mamad in hebrew) within a house or buliding
- 2. A public bomb shelter there is at least one in every moshav or kibbutz
- 3. In the interior stairwell of a buliding
- 4. In a room with no outside walls

WHAT TO DO DURING AN ALERT



PLEASE NOTE:

THE ARAVA IS FAR AWAY FROM THE GAZA STRIP, WHERE THE CONFLICT IS HAPPENING.
THERE HAS NEVER BEEN, IN ALL THE YEARS, ANY MISSILES THAT HAVE REACHED THE ARAVA FROM GAZA,
AND NEVER HAVE THE RESIDENTS HAD TO ENTER THE BOMB SHELTER DUE TO CONFLICT
WITH THE GAZA STRIP.
